
A Fresh Look at Classroom Management



Breaking Negative Cycles

Pre-empt problems: think ahead! Change your attitude: Think in terms of students with problems rather than problematic students. Watch Rob Plevin. (minute 2:13)

De-escalate conflict: Use non-confrontational statements rather than blaming and accusing.

Shift your focus to what you want to see rather than the behavior that you don't want to see.
Apologize when you are wrong. It is an opportunity to connect!

The Lesson "Autopsy"

Step 1: Look at the lesson Plan

- Content/Topic/Materials
- Scaffolding- sequencing/timing/transitions
- Instructions- clarity
- Variety- mode of classroom organization and interaction/ types of activities
 Differentiation different strokes for different folks: mixed ability classes

Step 2: Reflect upon the Classroom Climate

- **atmosphere**
- communication
- 3 r's: routine and rules and respect

Step 3: Special students/classes need special solutions

- stickers, charts, whatsapp, and genuine praise
- (S
- Be informed about special needs: ADHD and other learning difficulities.
