Tami Nakkar has been a teacher in Israel for 26 years. Currently she is a high school English teacher and an English instructor in Ruppin Academic Center. She loves bringing in technology and finding new ways to engage her students. She is passionate about teaching literature and making it relevant to her students in creative and innovative ways, while practicing all skills including listening and speaking.

Lori Roth made aliya with a Masters' Degree in Counseling Psychology from the University of Pennsylvania, worked as a family therapist and licensed school guidance counselor until she retrained as an English teacher. She has been teaching elementary school English for over 30 years and is the coordinator of the Northern District In-Service Counseling Team. Lori is the creator of the highly successful National Speak Up program to promote speaking with young learners. Songs, cheers, raps and chants are some of the many tools she enjoys sharing with teachers in the field.

Rebecca Schram-Zafrany is an English teacher and head of the English and Diplomacy departments at the Ginsburg High School in Yavne, Israel and has been a teacher for 33 years. She holds a BA in English Literature from Hebrew University in Jerusalem and an MA in Applied Linguistics from Tel Aviv University. Rebecca is also a storyteller who has performed and led workshops for educators, students, families and groups of all ages in the United States and Israel. She has written wonderful stories such as "The Miracle of the Black Pepper" and "Elijah's Yellow Balloon" which have been published in storybooks for everyone to read and enjoy.

Jackie Teplitz, PhD has been teaching in Israel for over 35 years. She is presently a teacher educator at Gordon Academic College of Education. Her expertise is in the areas of learning disabilities, literacy and technology in the EFL classroom. She is one of the contributors to the Pre-foundation Curriculum, 2019. She believes with all her heart there are no non-readers but rather there are emergent readers. She has developed teacher resources for the 44 phonemes of English to support the 'Speech to Print' Method of beginning literacy.


